

# PLASTIC PET CRATE

## Set-Up Guide

Thank you for purchasing the Petmode plastic pet crate. You will soon discover how quick and easy it is to set up. The Petmode plastic pet crate consists of parts: top half, bottom half, a package of wing nuts and bolts, a package of latches, one metal door, one handle and one feeder/waterer.

1. Remove plastic tie wraps that are holding the crate together.



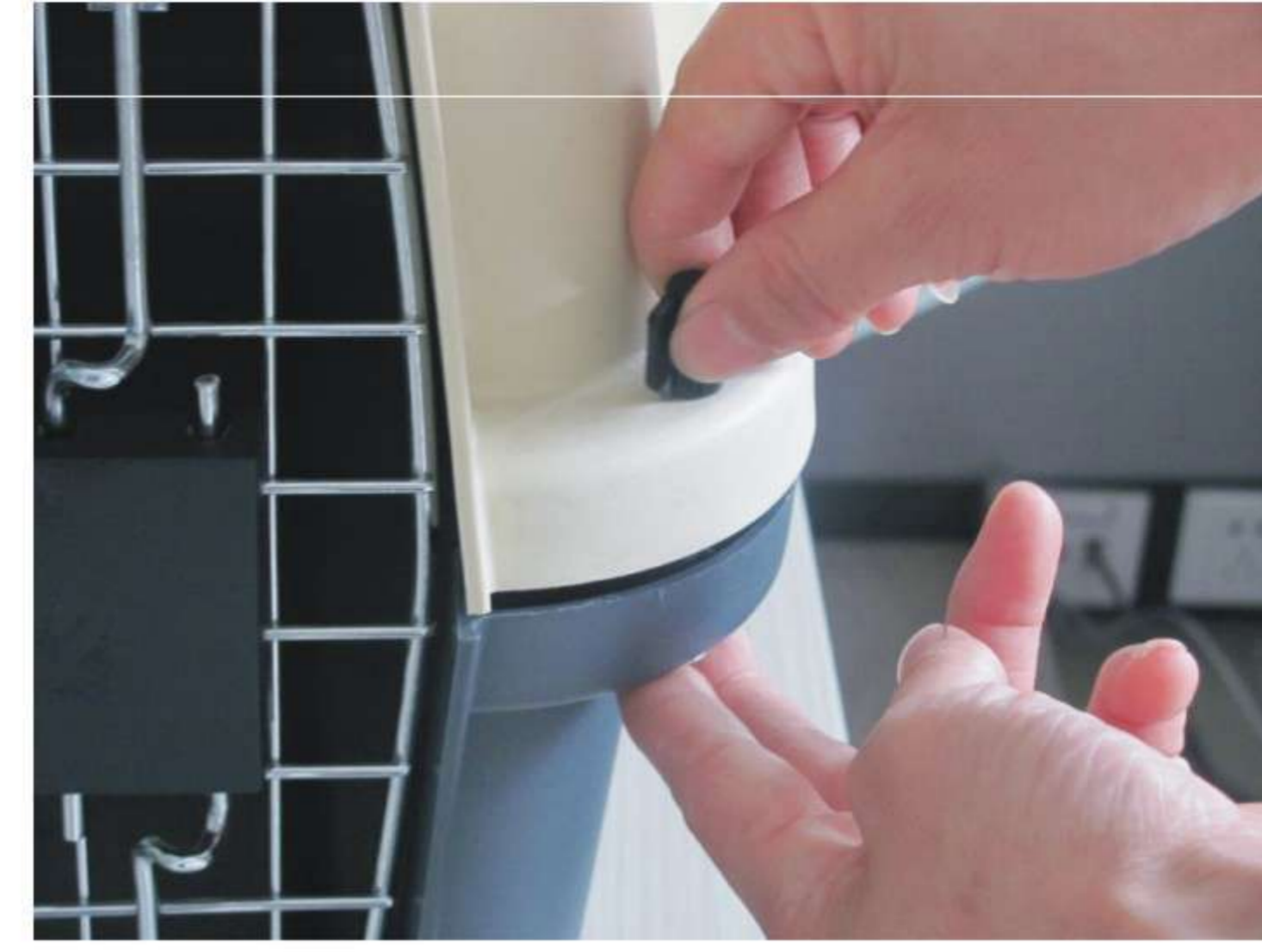

2. Separate two halves and place light colored half on top of dark colored half making sure that assembly holes on the top line up with assembly holes on the bottom. ( See picture 1 )

3. Assemble doors in each opening making sure that door rods are in recesses for proper door operation. (See picture 2 )

4. Insert metal bolt from bottom into square holes and thread on plastic nut. Complete bolt and nut assembly around entire crate. (See picture 3 )

5. Force the swing axis of the latch into the rod. Make sure the locking block is pushed into place in the direction of the arrow. ( See picture 4 and 5 )

6. Check to see that the door operate correctly and is secure enough to contain your pet. It is advisable to check nuts and bolts securing top and bottom halves together periodically to maintain tightness.

## User Guide

For safety reasons, we suggest removing your pet's collar, Id tags and clothing each time before it enters the homes. These items can result in a risk of strangulation.

Allow your pet to own its home. When you first set it up, Allow your pet to smell and explore its new home. Furnish It with bedding and chew toys for your pet to enjoy. Leave the door open while your pet is discovering its Home and adjusting to it. Never force your pet into the crate. Give praises when your pet goes into its home on its own.

After your pet is accustomed to its new home and enters it Willingly, close the door for short periods of time. While the Door is closed, praise your pet. If your pet barks, cries or Squeals, allow it to calm down before opening the door.

Slowly extend the time your pet spends in its home with the Door closed. Try leaving your pet for random 15 minute intervals. Once you return, take your pet outside to exercise and relieve itself. Make taking your pet outside each time you release it from its home A ritual.

To keep your pet happy and healthy, do not leave your pet in the home for Extended periods of time.

Puppies in training should not be left in the home for more than four hours At a time. While the puppy is training, it should be let out of its home to exercise and relieve itself at least once every four hours. Trained pets should be let out at least once every eight hours.

### IMPORTANT SAFETY TIPS

Remove your pet's collar, id tags and clothing each time before it enters The home.

Periodically check fasteners and tighten as needed to keep crate assembled Never stack crates with animals inside

Check door operation as needed to assure proper function

Use cargo hold-downs in corners of crate to secure crate when transporting In a vehicle.

Never leave pets unattended for extended periods of time in the crate

Do not allow children to play in or around the crate

Meets IATA requirements for shipping live animals. Check with airline for more details before shipping animals.
